



There are two upcoming events which you may want to put in your diaries:

Extraordinary Synod Meeting - Monday 20th February 2023 at 7pm



There is a matter of business which Executive wishes to bring to Synod, and which is time sensitive such that it needs to be considered before the end of February. For that reason, we will hold a 'Zoom' online Extraordinary Synod Meeting on the evening of Monday 20th February. Whilst it is impossible to be exact about timings, it is not expected that this will be an especially long meeting, and it is only expected to have one item of business to deal with.

Manchester and Salford Urban Mission— Workshop and Worship Day



Good fellowship and good food were shared when members of the 9 churches in the Manchester and Salford Urban Mission met for a getting-to-know-you-better session on 28th January. As a missional Partnership we know that it is good to meet, worship and pray together, and this seemed especially important as two churches – Dandelion

Community and Oasis/MediaCity church and Community Hub have joined in the past six months.

The day began, of course, with a welcome hot drink and biscuits and continued with reflective and challenging worship led by Liz Delafield, our mission and Discipleship Mentor. Breaking into small groups, we shared the stories of our individual churches and some personal faith journeys. There was much to discuss, and rich histories of churches meeting different challenges and often working together in past groupings. All the churches are in urban settings and often serving congregations in areas of deprivation, so a clear common theme was about finding ways to involve and serve the local communities in their various needs.

Relationships were strengthened over lunch as we shared common concerns. and celebrated an informal communion. The final session brought us together to learn more about the priorities Dandelion Community and their openness to their neighbours in Wythenshawe.


If you have never had a course on the Sacrament of Baptism, this course is required.

Bishop remembers victims of the holocaust and genocide

As the County prepares to join with people around the UK and the world to commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day this Friday the new Bishop of Blackburn-elect, Rt Rev. Philip North, has issued a reflective statement.

Holocaust Memorial Day, and the associated HMD Trust, encourages remembrance in a world scarred by genocide. It promotes and supports Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD) the international day on January 27 each year set aside to remember the six million Jews murdered during The Holocaust, alongside the millions of other people killed under Nazi rule.

The date chosen marks the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp in 1945. The HMD Trust also remembers those lost in more recent genocides, such as Cambodia, Rwanda and Bosnia.

Events to mark HMD are taking place across the County and include <u>exhibitions at the Anglican Cathedral in Blackburn</u>, running until February 3. The high schools' team from the Diocesan Board of Education has co-organised the Cathedral exhibitions, working in partnership with organisations including Blackburn with Darwen Standing Advisory Council on Religious Education (SACRE); the North East Religious Resources Centre; the Board of Deputies of British Jews and the Cathedral itself.

Children and young people from across the Diocese will get the chance to visit the exhibitions this week and next.

Speaking today, Bishop Philip commented:

"The Holocaust, also known as The Shoah in Hebrew, was a pivotal moment in history. "It was the first time the killing of human beings was industrialised and to a scale where, eventually, two-thirds of the Jewish population of Europe at the time - men, women and children - were murdered by the Nazis. Other groups that didn't fit the 'Nazi ideal' were also victims alongside the Jews. "As the numbers of survivors able to recall those terrible events rapidly dwindles, we who remain have a duty to continue to keep the memory of The Holocaust alive; and of other genocides since. "Holocaust Memorial Day is an important way we can do this; as we collectively take the opportunity to commit ourselves to stand together against antisemitism and all other kinds of prejudice and injustice."
