

Induction of our Transitional Moderator – Saturday 10th **June 2023**



As we begin preparing for the arrival of Revd Clare Downing in the North Western Synod as our Transitional Moderator, I am pleased to confirm that Clare's Induction is to take place on Saturday 10th June 2023 at Chorley URC.

The service will be led by Revd Fiona Bennett, General Assembly Moderator of the United Reformed Church and will take place at 3pm on Saturday.

Further details of the service, directions for travelling to Chorley, and other practical arrangements will be shared as the date gets nearer.

Fairhaven URC and St Anne's-on-Sea URC

They have been standing less than a couple of miles apart for well over 100 years, but as far as anyone knows the two United Reformed Churches in Lytham St Annes have never got together for a shared Sunday service. That surprising record was consigned to history on the morning of the 26th



February, the first Sunday in Lent, when the two congregations met in worship at Fairhaven URC (better known locally as the White Church).

Members and friends from St Annes-on-Sea URC were warmly welcomed to the service led by Revd Jim Williams, and there was a strong theme of togetherness running throughout the morning. All agreed that it was wonderful to see the church so full on what was a very happy occasion. The two choirs joined together in unison to create a wonderful accompaniment to the praise and worship, and afterwards friends old and new met together for refreshments in the hall.

A date has already been set in December, the first Sunday in Advent, when St Anne's will reciprocate and welcome members and worshippers from Fairhaven – something which both congregations are very much looking forward to.





Service to Mark the Completion of Ministry at Halton United Reformed Church within the Lancashire North Missional Partnership



On the 18th February 2023 over one hundred people gathered at Halton United Reformed Church to give glory to God for the Church's Mission which began in 1867. Among the congregation were descendants of the original founders of the church.

The final act of worship was a collaborative process. The congregation chose the hymns to tell the story of the church's outreach over the many decades. This included children's work, regular divine worship, community outreach and action for social justice. Former serving ministers at Halton



along with ecumenical friends also took part in the service. During the service pictures of church people and life were projected onto the screen.

We were pleased to welcome the Reverend Martyn Coe representing the North Western Synod. Towards the end of the service the congregation symbolically handed over to Martyn a copy of Rejoice and Sing and the front door key of the church. This was to acknowledge that after the service the congregation would cease to be a worshipping fellowship and the building will close as a United Reformed Church.



The service was brought to a close when the two Missional Partnership ministers, the Reverend Dr Irene John and the Reverend John Gordon shared together in giving the final Dismissal and Blessing. After the service outside caterers provided a wonderful buffet.

Thanks to the serving Elders, members of the congregation and the many friends of Halton URC who made our final service a very special and memorable occasion.

Recognition for Philip Oliver for 63 years long service

During worship on Sunday 26 February at Cheadle Hulme URC, Revd Jonnie Hill presented serving elder Mr Philip Oliver with a certificate of long service in recognition of his 63 years' service.

Philip first served as a deacon at Ladybridge Congregational Church and then as an elder after the formation of the United Reformed Church in 1972. Since Ladybridge URC closed some years ago, Philip has been a valued and much-loved member and elder at Cheadle Hulme URC.

At the young age of 87, Philip says he has no intention of slowing down. He regularly walks three to four miles a day and enjoys his regular games of walking football.


Walking into Holy Week—alongside the Mentors






Sunday 30 April 10.30am	Celebration Service with Rev David Jenkins.

Children and Youth Friendly Church Award




The Children and Youth Friendly Church Scheme can help your church improve the welcome it gives to children, young people and families.

Churches that join the scheme work with our CYDO, Leo Roberts, who helps them to identify what they're currently doing to welcome young people and develop ways to improve it. Leo will see if your church:

- has a comprehensive and shared vision for children's and youth work
- provides good opportunities for the voices of children and young people to be heard
- takes seriously and responds to feedback from children and young people
- provides opportunities for children and young people to be involved in planning,
- organising and delivering child friendly church services
- makes suitable provision for under 5s in church
- provides groups and organisations to help nurture children and young people
- takes safeguarding, health & safety and first aid seriously
