





Faith Filled Worship Northwestern Synod Taster Session Monday 12th June 7pm via zoom

Faith filled worship is those who have already completed Faith Filled Life, and would like to continue their journey by exploring the breadth and depth of Christian Worship, building confidence and equipping participants for leading and participating in worship. It is the URC's main training course for locally recognised lay preachers. It will be Synod wide via zoom.

The main aims of this stream are:

- to explore the various building blocks of Christian worship
- to consider worship, as an individual and in community, as a response to God's love and faithfulness.
- to think about how worship is a transformative activity where God is encountered and lives are changed.
- to examine how to hear, interpret and share God's word in scripture, prayer and preaching.
- to look at how to create contextual, meaningful and inclusive worship.
- to equip you for your discipleship journey and think about how worship is a central part of this.

Faith-filled Worship takes approximately 12 months to complete, going at the pace of the local group. Group meetings will take place approximately monthly. Between the group meetings you will also create a reflective journal and meet with a mentor – guidance for both of these activities is provided.

Faith Filled Life Northwestern Synod South Area Taster Session Friday 16th June 2pm via zoom

We are forming a new group to explore our faith journeys. The group will meet via a combination of zoom and in person meetings in the South area of the North Western Synod. We will arrange car shares if needed, and organise meeting times to suit the availability of participants. (Usually fortnightly)

Faith filled life is a seven session (about 2 hours per session) course exploring:

- Who am I? Exploring identity and faith
- Where do I fit? How faith shapes our daily life
- Where do I fit in my community? Thinking more about God's mission in the world and how you are part of it.
- My walk with God what journey am I on?
- Dealing with challenges? Building confidence and resilience for facing life's challenges
- Which way now? Looking back and looking forward.

It is an essential first Step in the URC's Stepwise training course and, for some opens a door to other Stepwise strands such as Faith Filled worship or leadership. It is for anyone, at whatever point in their faith journey, to explore their faith journey within a supportive group. It also involves a group project, meetings with a mentor and additional reflection/perperation between sessions.

United Refomed Church members show support to coffee morning event during the Refugee Week in Blackburn

On 22 June, Community Harmony Project (CHP - Blackburn) will celebrate Refugee Week through the Coffee Morning at the Quakers Meeting House, Blackburn. Theme of the event is 'Compassion.' Some members of the local United Reformed Churches will attend the event to show their support to the refugee initiatives in Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council.

The event will be an opportunity to celebrate Refugee Week, to listen to the encouraging and resilient voices of asylum seekers and refugees. It would also be a time to recognise the services of refugees' locally. The Mayor of Blackburn, Councillor Parwaiz Akhtar, will give an award to a refugee who showed compassion to the destitute people.

There will be a quiz and lighting the Peace & Harmony Candle. International food will also be served.

More than fifty people from different walks of life (councillors, members of local charities and concerned citizens) will attend the event.



Exploring Resilience In Churches

URC Training- a collaboration between Children and Youth Work and Education and Learning.

Thursday 22nd June- self-care and resilience. 7.15-8.45pm. Led by Adam Scott.

This first session will focus on personal resilience or self-care. Resilience is a word we use a lot, especially recently, and Adam will help us explore what it means for us as individuals in the world we live in as we adapt and endure through times of change.

Thursday 29th June- Resilience and community-care. 7.15-8.45pm. Led by Adam Scott. This second session will focus on community resilience or community care. We can be adaptable and have worked on our own resilience, but our external environment affects us each day. Adam will help us explore what community resilience is, how important it is and how change can help us all flourish.

The Revd Dr Adam Scott is the Principal at Northern College, Manchester, which is one of the Resource Centres for Learning that offers learning and training opportunities for the URC.

Thursday 6th July- Enabling resilience (making safe spaces). 7.15-8.45pm.

Led by Alex Clare-Young.

This session will focus on practical things we can do/offer/give access to in church buildings, gatherings and community spaces. Alex will encourage thinking around how we manage space and self in relation to enabling resilience and flourishing.

The Revd Dr Alex Clare-Young is an ordained URC Minister working in a Pioneer role with Downing Place Church in Cambridge City Centre

URC Church Safeguarding Coordinators training

All United Reformed Churches are required to appoint a safeguarding coordinator for children and adults. Smaller churches may consider appointing one or two coordinators for a group of churches.

Understand how the role of the Church Safeguarding Coordinator can work with the leadership of the church to ensure that they can create a positive safeguarding culture

Lundie Award

The Lundie Memorial Award celebrates the good work a child or young person is doing for their church and community.

If you know a child or young person who is playing their part in the mission of God in their church or Synod, their local community or the wider world, please nominate them for a Lundie Memorial Award and help shine a light on their achievements.

Each month, a medal and certificate will be awarded to one of the nominated children and young people, along with a financial gift of £100 to be spent to benefit children and/or young people in the church, synod or local community, however the award winner chooses.

Nomination areas

Good work can be interpreted in many different ways, so there are no hard and fast categories for this award. Suggested nomination areas are:

- a young carer
- a young person running a holiday club
- a child volunteering at a dementia café
- a young person fund raising for a Messy Church outing
- a young person providing live music for services
- a child raising money for an overseas development project
- a young person training older people in the use of technology
- a child who turns up early every week to set out the chairs for a club
- a young person volunteering as a peer mentor at college
- anyone under 26 who is playing their part in the mission of God in any way

Making a nomination


Anyone under the age of 25 can be nominated and anybody can make a nomination at any time of the year.

You will also need to get the nominee (and their parents if they are under 18) to sign the form to show they agree to you sending their details.
