

Extraordinary Synod Meeting - Tuesday 18th July 2023

Synod Executive wishes to call an Extraordinary Synod meeting to take place, by Zoom, on the evening of Tuesday 18th July 2023 starting at 7pm. Please save this date, and join the meeting if you are able to do so.

The main piece of business is a continuation of the very productive and useful conversations which began at our Spring Synod as we consider how best to deploy the ordained ministers available to us within North Western Synod.

Synod will be invited to consider the appointment of an Ecumenical Mentor whose focus will be on ecumenical partnerships around the North West. We are fortunate to have a number of LEPs (Local Ecumenical Projects) within the Synod; 'God for All' and the South West United Area, in Cumbria are exciting and positive opportunities to develop work with our ecumenical partners; opportunities to work together across the wider Synod with ecumenical partners are ever present and could be developed as we work more closely – all of which could benefit from a dedicated Ecumenical Mentor supporting and encouraging that work.

Synod will also be asked to think about appointing a Transitional Minister – someone who would be available to help a church or group of churches, or Missional Partnership anywhere within the Synod when a particular need arises. Examples are where a particular project is being undertaken which would benefit from additional input from a Minister; situations where a particular congregation or Partnership is struggling and needs some intensive support from a Minister; periods when a Partnership is in vacancy, between the departure of a Partnership minister and the call of a new one....the possibilities are extensive, and exciting.

There will be more detailed information coming out about these thoughts over the next few weeks in readiness for the meeting, along with a Zoom link as the date approaches.

Please do try to attend this meeting if you are able to do so.

welcome Revd Clare Downing as the new Moderator of North Western Synod. The sun shone, and a sense of celebration and joy was palpable as people gathered from all around Synod and beyond to mark this special occasion.

Revd Dr John Bradbury (General Secretary), Revd Fiona Bennett (General Assembly Moderator) and Clare all arrived at Chorley earlier in the day to see some of the work at Chorley's award winning 'Repair Café' and to be interviewed by BBC Lancashire before the service started.

Methodist, Baptist, Anglican and Salvation Army colleagues, along with the Mayor of Chorley, welcomed Clare to the North West during the service. John Bradbury preached on Luke's account of the disciples walking the road to Emmaus when Jesus fell into step with them along their way and joined them on their journey. Chorley URC—Tree Planting at Clare's Induction

After her induction on Saturday, Rev Clare Downing, along with Rev Dr John Bradbury and Rev Fiona Bennett took a few minutes to plant trees in the gardens at Chorley URC. These three apple trees will, in the fullness of time, provide food, shelter and shade for wildlife and humans alike.

The trees are part of a gardening project at Chorley where, with Council funding, raised beds are being created and existing green areas improved. People from across the community will be able to learn new skills in gardening and cooking and eat the produce grown.

More fruit trees will be added later in the year, along with fruit bushes and perennial plants. creating a beautiful, biodiverse and nectar rich green space accessible to the local community.





United Reformed Church members show support to coffee morning event during the Refugee Week in Blackburn


On 22 June, Community Harmony Project (CHP - Blackburn) will celebrate Refugee Week through the Coffee Morning at the Quakers Meeting House, Blackburn. Theme of the event is 'Compassion.' Some members of the local United Reformed Churches will attend the event to show their support to the refugee initiatives in Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council.

The event will be an opportunity to celebrate Refugee Week, to listen to the encouraging and resilient voices of asylum seekers and refugees. It would also be a time to recognise the services of refugees' locally. The Mayor of Blackburn, Councillor Parwaiz Akhtar, will give an award to a refugee who showed compassion to the destitute people.

There will be a quiz and lighting the Peace & Harmony Candle. International food will also be served.

More than fifty people from different walks of life (councillors, members of local charities and concerned citizens) will attend the event.

Lundie Award

The Lundie Memorial Award celebrates the good work a child or young person is doing for their church and community.

If you know a child or young person who is playing their part in the mission of God in their church or Synod, their local community or the wider world, please nominate them for a Lundie Memorial Award and help shine a light on their achievements.

Each month, a medal and certificate will be awarded to one of the nominated children and young people, along with a financial gift of £100 to be spent to benefit children and/or young people in the church, synod or local community, however the award winner chooses.

Nomination areas

Good work can be interpreted in many different ways, so there are no hard and fast categories for this award. Suggested nomination areas are:

- a young carer
- a young person running a holiday club
- a child volunteering at a dementia café
- a young person fund raising for a Messy Church outing
- a young person providing live music for services
- a child raising money for an overseas development project
- a young person training older people in the use of technology
- a child who turns up early every week to set out the chairs for a club
- a young person volunteering as a peer mentor at college
- anyone under 26 who is playing their part in the mission of God in any way

Making a nomination


Anyone under the age of 25 can be nominated and anybody can make a nomination at any time of the year.

To make a nomination, download and complete a nomination form (<u>Lundie Memorial Award -</u> <u>United Reformed Church</u>) and send it by post or email to <u>cydo@nwsynod.org.uk</u>

You will also need to get the nominee (and their parents if they are under 18) to sign the form to show they agree to you sending their details.

It would be great if you can send a good quality original sized photo of the nominee, preferably doing something connected with their nomination. If they win, this photograph may be used on the URC website or other publicity to celebrate their achievement.

Assembly Accredited Lay Preacher Programme . . .

There's still time for you to register for the Assembly Accredited Lay Preachers programme which begins in the autumn. If you would like to pursue this opportunity, write to me for more information. Continuing Studies Fund for Ministers . . .

Any United Reformed Church minister who is eligible to apply for EM3 funding is also eligible to apply for support through the Continuing Studies Fund. The Fund is not available for ministers from other denominations working with the United Reformed Church.

This assistance is offered to help ministers serving in ways that are recognised by the United Reformed Church. The Continuing Studies Fund can be called upon after all EM3 sources have been exhausted, including sabbatical funding and "rolled-over" annual EM3 allowances.

A number of activities are eligible for support from the Continuing Studies Fund:

- Part-time study for higher degrees. Funds might, for example, be used towards the payment of fees, research expenses, or the cost of having the thesis bound in the requisite number of copies.
- Professional development programmes such as CIPD (Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development)
- The fund offers a maximum annual amount of up to £350 for a Bachelors' degree, Graduate Diploma, or professional development programme and up to £500 towards a Postgraduate Diploma, Masters or PhD. Repeat requests are allowed, throughout the duration of study.

Applications for this support should be made to the Secretary for Education by way of Rob Hoch, NWS Training and Learning Mentor. Forms can be submitted at any time, but the annual closing date for applications is **30 June**. Decisions are normally made in early July ready for the start of the academic year. Please write to Rob

(<u>learningmentor@nwsynod.org.uk</u>) for application and information.

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Continuing Studies Fund for Lay Learners . . .

Lay applicants are now eligible to apply for support through the Continuing Studies Fund (CSF). This funding is not available to lay members outside the United Reformed Church working with other denominations. A number of activities are already eligible for support from the Continuing Studies Fund:

- Part-time study for higher degrees. Funds might, for example, be used towards the payment of fees, research expenses, or the cost of having the thesis bound in the requisite number of copies.
- Professional development programmes such as CIPD (Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development).

The fund offers a maximum annual amount of up to £350 for a Bachelors' degree, Graduate Diploma, or professional development programme and up to £500 towards a Postgraduate Diploma, Masters or PhD. If the applicant is an Assembly Accredited Lay Preacher, they can put their £300 annual grant towards this. Repeat requests are allowed throughout the duration of study.

Applications can also be made for a broad range of subjects, not just theological. For example, bookkeeping courses for treasurers and MS Word courses for secretaries will be considered.

There are five conditions to be met before a grant will be considered:

- The applicant must be someone who serves the URC in a voluntary capacity, needs to have been a member of a URC for at least two years and remain a URC member throughout the duration of the course.
- The application needs to be for a course from a recognised establishment.
- The applicant must explain how this learning will enhance or support their role/ ministry in a local church context.
- All the remaining funding needs to be in place before a grant is given.
- The form needs to be endorsed by both the local church and the Synod.

Applications for this support should be made to the Secretary for Education. Forms can be submitted at any time, but the annual closing date for applications is **30 June**. Decisions are normally made in early July ready for the start of the academic year. Please write to Rob (<u>learningmentor@nwsynod.org.uk</u>) for application and information.
