#### **Living Stones for a Living Church**

In many communities, buildings which can act as a hub for community life are at a premium. Perhaps most importantly, this has impacted on places where people can simply come together to meet with friends or to access community based support and advice services. A consequence of this is growing issues of social isolation. Similarly, local community groups find it increasingly difficult to find affordable places to meet or to work from.

Often local churches are one of the few, if not the only, place in particular communities which could offer a space to respond to these and broader community needs, for example around affordable housing and homelessness.

Recently, the Synod was asked to lead a meeting of the URC's Church Buildings Forum looking at how churches could make better use of their buildings to respond to the needs of local communities. As part of this with the support and contribution from four of our churches we produced a short film, showing different ways in which church buildings can be used with the community and shared something of the motivations and benefits of using their buildings to respond to needs in their local communities.

We hope it may provide you with some inspiration about how your buildings could be adapted to respond to needs in your local community.

#### **Richmond Poppies launch event**



Churches in Bewcastle attended a special event at Carlisle Castle on June 8th. Organised by the Northern Region of the Donkey Breed Society, the event launched the display of purple Richmond Poppies, part of its work to commemorate all animals and birds involved in war work. Bewcastle has a long connection with these military animals and Bishop John gave a short address reminding us of the bond between all God's living creatures. Heather Armstrong and Barbara Smith, members of the Knowe URC Church pictured looking at the poppies, are both descendents of men who served in the Westmoreland and Cumberland Yeomanry calvary regiment in the First World War. Their pictures and stories feature in a

booklet about animals in military service produced as part of the project.

#### Foundation Safeguarding e-Learning

Any person with a role in a URC church that has not completed URC safeguarding training in the last 3 years is required to complete the Foundation e-learning as a minimum, ideally individually, but it can be facilitated in small groups if people do not have access to the internet, a computer/ device or both.

This training is:

<u>Mandatory</u> for people who are leading groups involving adults and/or children in churches. Recommended for Church Safeguarding Coordinators and all other people in leadership roles.





URC Children's Workers Together – THE CONFERENCE: exploring how we work with children together

In response to popular demand, URC Children's and Youth Work are holding our first ever Children's Worker Conference from 1-3 November 2024 at Ripon College, Cuddeston, Oxford OX44 9EX.

If you are actively engaged in children's ministry within the URC, whether as an employed worker or on a voluntary basis, this weekend is for you. It's a chance to share together, to be inspired and informed, to worship together, and to consider how we might increase opportunities for child participation, mutual storytelling, and creativity.

Bookings opened on 1 May 2024 and places will be allocated to allow a fair distribution of synods represented, with a waiting list in operation until June 1, when any remaining spaces will be allocated. From 1 June we will also be taking bookings for day visitors.

Costs will be £150 for residential and £35 per day for day visitors. Funding is available from North Western Synod.

## Dreams, Hopes & Aspirations for a Just Society: Towards a People's General Election Manifesto 2024



As we prepare for the general election in the UK on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July 2024, it is time for responsible citizens in our communities to understand and unravel the realities of our times, to be at the forefront of sensitizing our communities to be politically engaged and strive for a just society, where justice, equality, inclusiveness and liberation will thrive and be celebrated.

Today the British Political landscape is complex with the gap between the 'haves and have-nots' ever widening, the cost-of-living crisis deepening with economic inequality on the one hand, and on the other vulnerable communities being pushed into further marginalisation. These communities include people with disabilities, people seeking refuge and sanctuary, people of migration, people struggling with housing crisis, people discriminated by race, colour, gender, sexuality, and young people.

The global contexts of ongoing conflict, war, geo-political tensions, ecological crisis, poverty and hunger call on the British electorate to choose leaders wisely as their decisions on global issues are important.

If politics is about 'polis' people and polity, and if elections are about choosing those who can serve the 'polis', now is the time to redeem and reclaim politics as our public civic tool where democracy for a just society is affirmed. In such a context, we the people of UK, who feel called to building a just society nurturing peace, love, justice, fairness, dignity and equality in the public sphere, are envisaging a creative political space where people's dreams, hopes and aspirations for a better society are heard, shared and voiced out.

This creative political space will be a space with a preferential option for those on the margins, airing their voices, concerns and issues of life today. Through this process a people's general election manifesto for 2024 will evolve, and will be shared with the citizens of the public sphere in the hope of sensitizing the electorate and therefore see the election of candidates who will address these life issues.

The next government must put people on the margins at the centre of their vision. This will deliver a real change for the betterment of all people and communities. This general election is a chance for the citizenry to strive for a just society. It is not about personalities, but about policies, where justice issues will be the guiding principles in making our country and our planet a better place to live.

#### **General Election Resources**

With a General Election on the very near horizon, and called in the speed that it has been, it may feel like there is little time to respond or prepare.

General elections are Kairos moments. In the Bible Kairos moments are decisive times, a crossroads.

It is important that's churches and individual Christian disciples, we engage with the democratic process, and encourage both participation and decision making based on the values of the Gospel. In many of our communities there will be people who need our support to have their say (for example to get registered, get some ID, or to apply for a postal vote if needed).

This is also a great opportunity for churches to be seen engaging in the civic and public life of our communities, for example by holding hustings and other community listening events.



The Joint Public Issues Team, our ecumenical 'think tank' on the church response to the growing issues of social, political and global injustice, has produced some very helpful resources to support us in responding with our ecumenical partners to see what is possible. It may be challenging the candidates standing in your constituency to focus on issues that matter to us or it could be hosting a hustings. All that you need is contained in the link here -

Alongside this another initiative spearheaded by JPIT is the Let's End Poverty campaign. In anticipation of a General Election the team made it a priority to call all candidates to respond to the growing tide of poverty that is blighting so many lives on our doorsteps in the UK. So often political parties pledge to build a



'strong economy' as though it is the solution to all the problems. As we have seen so many times a so-called strong economy is not always, or often, a fair economy which benefits everyone.

Along with other reps from the URC, I attended an online rally last week where Let's End Poverty launched their resources. These are designed to help Christians and churches frame the questions that can challenge those who hope to lead us, and those who will be elected, to put poverty at the heart of their campaign and the future agenda of government.

This of course fits with our belief in God's heart and bias for the poor that both informs and directs us as a denomination.

One area of poverty sadly not addressed by Let's End Poverty is that faced by people seeking asylum and refuge in the UK, many of whom face destitution.



City of Sanctuary UK have produced some resources to help us stand with and campaign for those who it is likely will only be referred to under the banner of 'net migration' in the coming few weeks and probably rarely, if ever, in a positive and humane light.

It would be great to find ways of standing together with our brothers and sisters in Christ as well as those of other faiths as we respond to the imminent election. To quote the late Jo Cox, 'We are far more united and have far more in common with each other than things that divide us.' This election is an opportunity to celebrate that and champion it as we hold those who seek public service, as well as ourselves who will elect, to account.

#### Important dates

Hold these dates in your prayers. Remember that often the most vulnerable in your communities may need support coming up to these dates to make sure they can vote.

- 13<sup>th</sup> June: Deadline to register to vote.
- 14<sup>th</sup> June: Deadline to apply for a postal vote.
- 19<sup>th</sup> June: Deadline for proxy votes and voter authority certificates.
- 4<sup>th</sup> July: Election Day (Remember people will need to bring ID with them)
