

Anti-Poverty Research Community Summit


On 28th November representatives from the Dandelion Community in Wythenshawe, Church action on Poverty and Northwester Synod joined a gathering of community organisations at Manchester University. This event was co-delivered by Inspire Women from Oldham and Manchester University Social Sciences department. It is part of a project aimed at finding ways to research issues around poverty, working with local communities.

The purposes of this event were:

- 1. To revisit our Anti-Poverty Framework through making 'creative connections'.
- 2. To nurture connections with people who feel passionately about building and maintaining an antipoverty research community in Manchester.
- 3. To think about the future of our Anti- Poverty Research Community.
- 4. To have fun and create together!

This was a great opportunity to make connections and to reflect together.

yourchurch news!

There has been lots happening at **yourchurch** during the past weeks. On 3 October, we received three people into joint membership, bringing our total of members (ie those whose sole membership is with **yourchurch**) to 14 and our joint membership (ie those whose primary membership is held with their local church) to 14.

Then on Sunday 2 December, Clare Downing, our Moderator, ordained and inducted our first ever elected elders. When **yourchurch** became a member church of the Synod and United Reformed Church at General Assembly 2023, it was agreed that the existing Leadership Team would be recognised as a de facto Elders' Meeting and charged with electing a team of elders.

Clare ordained and inducted Revd Fran Kissack, Revd Kristin Ofstad (living in Spain), Revd Jane Campbell, Revd Ruth Watson and Diana Paulding. She also inducted Lawrence Heath-Moore and Angela Storer, who were already ordained elders. Addie Redmond was unable to be present and will be inducted to serve early in the New Year.

Last night, we journeyed (virtually!) to Bethlehem, where our joint Advent Carol Service was led by Revd Dr Munther Isaac, Dean of Bethlehem Bible College and Pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Christmas Church in Bethlehem. As he did last year, Munther conducted the service from what has become the internationally renowned installation in the church, Christ Among the Rubble.

It was an extraordinary privilege to be led in a powerful, prophetic and deeply moving reflection of what it meant for Palestinian Christians to be spending a second Christmas with the genocidal slaughter of Gaza ongoing.

If you want to get a flavour of Munther's address, <u>watch this reflection</u> set to music, which formed part of the service (in place of a carol). You can also watch the video of the version of <u>O Little Town of Bethlehem</u>, put together by the students of Bethlehem Bible College.



This is for anyone who wants to take seriously the reality of Christ and Christ's reconciling work in our world.


We will read aloud as a group and then, share our reactions (as we are willing) to the reading in about 3 minutes or so each, before opening to more general conversation.




How about putting together a group from your church to do a "pilot study"? You can support and encourage one another and Michael will work personally with the group.





Safeguarding Training

Foundation Safeguarding e-Learning

Any person with a role in a URC church that has not completed URC Safeguarding Training in the last 3 years is required to complete the **Foundation** e-learning module as a minimum, ideally individually. However it can be facilitated in small groups if people do not have access to the internet, a computer / device or both.

Safeguarding is Everyone's Responsibility



You must have completed **Foundation** Training before you can complete **Intermediate** Training.



Renewal of the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme

The Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme is up for renewal in March 2025.

If not renewed, it will not be possible to reclaim the VAT on works to listed church buildings, which will have a massive negative financial impact on our listed buildings. The Catholic Bishops' Conference in England and Wales have set up an e-campaign so that people can easily send a letter to their local MPs and/or the Minister Lisa Nandy from the Department for Culture Media and Sport.

The link https://www.cbcew.org.uk/listed-places-of-worship-grant-scheme/ asks you to fill in your details, and this then takes you to the pre-written text of a letter, which you are free to use or edit before sending.

For some ecumenical partners the difference this grant scheme makes is immense. Whilst we may not have a large number of listed buildings within the Synod, the ability to reclaim VAT on building works is really valuable, so please consider supporting this campaign.
