

### **Thanksgiving service—Blackford Bridge**



The final chapter of Blackford Bridge URC's story unfolded on a poignant weekend in January 2025. The church welcomed its congregation one last time for a series of thanksgiving services, creating a space for members to share cherished memories and bid farewell to the beloved building that had been their spiritual home for generations.

Our esteemed moderator, Rev'd Clare Downing, delivered a touching sermon on Saturday. She reminded us of a profound truth: every church, planted with love and purpose in its community, must eventually complete its ministry. While it's deeply moving that this transition falls to our generation, she assured us that this "ending" creates fertile ground for God's new beginnings. Sunday witnessed a more intimate service on Sunday, led by Rev'd Anne Stokes, with a wonderful sharing of communion.





The weekend drew dear friends from across the country. Rev'd Nigel Uden, who once served as a student minister of the former pastorate, graced us with a final, magnificent performance on the church organ. Rev'd Ruth Wollaston shared heartwarming recollections of her ministry, while Peter Cole—representing the last of three generations of Coles who worshipped here—offered touching reflections. Through both formal testimonies and warm conversations that followed, a beautiful theme emerged: the story of a loving God who faithfully accompanies us through life's journey, in both joyful and challenging times.

We extend our deepest respect to the final generation of faithful members who shepherded their beloved church to its close. We give thanks for their unwavering witness in the community, and our prayers go with them as they embark on new paths of worship and discovery. May God continue to guide and bless them in the chapters that lie ahead.

### **Ruth Watson's Sabbatical Reflection**



We were richly blessed on Tuesday, 28 January, with Rev. Ruth Watson's sabbatical presentation, "Where Words Fail" — around twenty people attended, with half in person and the other half on Zoom.

Ruth began by asking us to think about where we were when John F. Kennedy was assassinated in 1963, or the Manchester Arena bombing in 2017, or the 2007 London attacks — except for the first incident (a few of us weren't born yet), all of us could remember where we were. The next

question stumped the group: "Do you remember the hymn you sang on the following Sunday?" None of us recalled that bit of our faith story.

But that wasn't really the point of the question, because in fact many of us had memories of music, lots of music actually, that we associate with these events, including for example Elton John's "Candle in the Wind" (1997) following Princess Diana's death. Where popular music helped a nation and different generations grieve, church music tended towards the familiar and often dated "praise of the privileged" while leaving the more uncomfortable emotions of the human community unnamed and unexpressed.

Ruth pointed to the psalmist as our guidebook for the depth and emotive range of how people of faith might express their questions and their pain — as well as their joy. In addition to thinking through the Book of Psalms, Ruth shared how her sabbatical journey with the so-called authors of "Devil's Music" (Metallica, Ozzy Osborne, among others) can challenge and inspire our singing traditions. Ruth quoted from Martin Luther (or some other worthy, we're not sure who deserves credit): "Why should the devil get all the best tunes?" Ruth challenged us to be bold and ready to embrace the whole of the human experience rather than only the bits that make us happy. Thank you, Ruth!





Youthscape Essentials is an innovative course for volunteers and paid youth leaders that increases your skills and understanding about working alongside young people today. Whether you're running a community project, a church youth group, or occasionally helping out on a Sunday morning, the course is designed with you in mind! It's not about the numbers of young people attending, it's about putting God at the centre of your youth ministry.

It's 10 sessions covering 30 topics. The topics are divided into Insights into Young People, Skills for Youth Work and Developing Character. You'll listen to young people, learn from professionals, participate in practical exercises and take time to deepen your own faith. It makes no assumptions about your experience, age or background. It's accessible to those starting out as volunteers, but deep enough to stretch those who have been working alongside young people for longer.


