

# CTE Forum 2025 – The Hayes Conference Centre 17—19<sup>th</sup> March 2025

I'm writing this whilst still trying to process the many things that I heard and experienced at the Churches Together in England Forum 2025 whose theme this year was 'Called to be One – but not the same'.

With nearly 300 delegates in attendance it was a profoundly diverse conference in every sense of the word and above all a huge encouragement to those who value the potential for a deeper church unity between the numerous denominations that make up the church in this country.

What was also hugely encouraging was that, despite being one of the smaller denominations, the URC has an integral role to play in helping the realization of the ecumenical vision against what, in her closing speech, the Rev Canon Helen Cameron described as the 'scandal of our disunity'.

The Forum took place at The Hayes conference centre in Derbyshire with an incredibly varied and intense 48 hour programme spread over 3 days.

A variety of keynote speakers from across the denominational and non-denominational spectrum addressed topics like The Call to Peace in a world resourcing war; Artificial Intelligence – considering when to embrace and when to exercise caution; Racial Justice and the call for Reparations; Navigating Change from church decline to flourishing and so much more.

The Moderator of the General Assembly, Rev Dr Tessa Henry-Robinson, gave the address on Racial Justice and Reparations. Tessa's talk was wise, passionate and refreshingly uncompromising as she reminded us of the unrepaired breach caused by historic trafficking and slavery, '...without repair/reparation there is no holistic or whole 'Alleluia' for the church.'

Surprisingly, perhaps, responses to the address were and continue to be quite mixed. Along with all the talks you can watch and listen for yourself on Youtube – search for Churches Together in England and you should find the page.

A very different talk from another URC voice and well worth listening to is Rev Dr Susan Durber's address on the First Ecumenical Council at Nicaea 1700 years ago. Like me, when I first saw it, your response to the title might be 'Meh. No thanks' but please let me encourage you. This is the second time I have heard Susan speak on this topic and I can only say what an engaging, creative and entertaining speaker she is and as another delegate put it – she makes you feel like you're there 'in the room where it happened' as well as seeing where there are still lessons for us to learn in the present. Again this is available on the Youtube channel.

There were also workshops exploring many important issues like accessible church, intercultural church, Israel/Palestine conflict, creating healthy culture and living with diverse views on human sexuality and gender. Everything was set in a framework of prayer and worship with the opportunity to share in a rich and wide array of different styles, approaches and theology.

The overriding feeling I came away with was that the most important gift the Forum offered us was the challenge to pursue meaningful ecumenical relationships and dialogue that can grow and develop even when we are different in our approaches, our opinions and our theology. The final speaker reminded us that 'Ecumenism must not become a technical conversation but our quest for finding hope in the unity Christ gives us.' Our country and the world needs a united church. One that acknowledges our differences but is ready to confront them together. A church prepared to live faithfully and creatively in the face of our diversity.

### Would you like to visit Sicily in October 2025?

The United Reformed Church Waldensian Fellowship has been organising visits to the Waldensian (Protestant) Church in Italy since 1980. This year we shall visit Sicily, an island of extraordinary history and beauty. We shall:

Explore Palermo, the crowded and exotic capital of the island, and the Norman cathedral of Monreale

Hear about the social and teaching work in a visit to La Noce, the Waldensian church's centre in the city

Spend some time in Servizio Cristiano, a Waldensian Church centre of education and agriculture, at Riesi in the deprived centre of the island

Visit Scicli, where the church is a centre for the support of migrants (and featured in the Montalbano television series)

And finish in Siracusa, once the most important city in the Western world with a beautiful island centre

On our journey we would visit historic sites such as the Greek temples at Agrigento

The visit is expected to last ten nights, or thirteen for a longer stay in Siracusa. We will stay at Servizio Cristiano and in hotels.

At this stage we can only estimate a cost but ten nights should cost of the order of £1,000 and thirteen nights £1,200. Single rooms would cost more.

We will give more information as the details are worked out. Travel to and from Italy will not be included. Participants will have to arrange travel to Palermo and return from Siracusa or Catania.
