News from Bury United Reformed Church

The Trials and Tribulations of a Harvest Festival and Lunch

Pilots Camp 2025





Table Talk Coasters



A new partnership between the conversation-starter charity Ugly Duckling and the United Reformed Church is looking to put coasters on tables throughout the UK and spark one million faith-informed conversations in two years.

Many thousands of eco-friendly coasters are being produced as part of Ugly Duckling's TableTalk resources – a range of products designed to help people have life-changing conversations.

Each coaster is designed with a few questions to spark a conversation, as well as a QR code that links to a daily question on Ugly Duckling's website. And to drive the initiative forward, 100,000 of the coasters are being distributed by the URC, each one bearing a unique URC question: "When have you been filled with wonder?"

Suitable for use in homes, cafés, churches, universities, workplaces, or even left for someone to pick up from a train table, the coasters can be used by anyone in any space. They can be simply left for someone to ponder on their own, or used in a more intentionally missional way – for example, by volunteers at coffee mornings.

Statement from the GM Faith and Belief Panel & GM Faith Community Leaders



Following the recent incident at Heaton Park Synagogue, our prayers are with the Jewish community following this attack. Please find below a statement from Greater Manchester Faith Community Leaders and a prayer from the North Western Synod, which you may find helpful and which can be used by churches.

"We stand in solidarity with the local Jewish community following a serious incident at a synagogue in north Manchester. This is an appalling attack on Yom Kippur, the holiest day of the Jewish year.

We share the Mayor of Greater Manchester's thoughts: "We think of them and their families as they recover from this incident".

We affirm the work of the emergency services and pray for the wider Jewish community who are understandably in shock.

We ask that people do not speculate on any aspect of the incident.

Today and every other day the Faith Communities in Greater Manchester actively stand together against hate and with our diverse communities."

With our Jewish sisters and brothers, we grieve, mourn, and pray, bringing to the Eternal One, our pain and protest, our tears and tenderness, our fears and failures.

O Most High,

we lift to You all who live in fright and anger, especially today the Jewish communities of Manchester;

bring peace and security, tenderness – even in the face of tragedy, and balm for the affliction of our souls.

With those praying and fasting, Risen Lord, we long for redemption from hatred and terror.

We yearn for a just and equal world where all are safe,

whether in the street, at work, or at worship in synagogue, mosque, temple, gurdwara, or church.

Guide with Your wisdom, Holy Spirit, the police and security services as they investigate,

civic and religious leaders as they work for calm, that none may exploit devastation to bring division, so that believer and non believer alike may work together for the good of all.

Finally, Eternal God,

we remember before You those murdered today, and their family, friends, and communities, may your perpetual light shine upon them, and give them peace as we seek to build a better world.

Amen.
