Experience Advent Event at Gatley URC

The event was led by Rev'd Stephanie Atkins, who thoughtfully adapted the Experience Advent content to suit the ages and needs of the children attending. In the weeks leading up to the event, Steph worked closely with staff from Gatley Primary to ensure the session was inclusive, safe, and accessible. Alot of care was taken around student ratios, additional needs, allergy requirements, timings, quiet-space planning, and coordinating a large number of very young children.





We were also blessed with the support of a fantastic volunteer team, whose hard work made the event run so smoothly. Our thanks go to Pastor K, Liz Delafield, Alison Haigh, Kelly Gibson, Lottie Gibson, and the two Year 9 helpers from Kingsway High School, Theo and Oliver, whose creativity and enthusiasm made a huge contribution to the morning. Their teamwork, care, and calm presence were invaluable in managing over 100 young children across multiple spaces.



We were thrilled to receive extremely positive feedback from the school. After the session, Colette Lowe, Acting SENCO at Gatley Primary, sent the following message:






Senior Faith Leaders issue joint response to Child Poverty Strategy

Senior faith leaders have issued a joint response to the government's recently published Child Poverty Strategy.

In it, they welcome the most significant policy change in the strategy, the removal of the two-child limit on benefits, which is set to directly lift 450,000 children out of poverty by the end of the decade. Faith groups had campaigned against the limit since its inception.

Signatories to the statement include Bishops representing the Church of England and Roman Catholic Church, Senior Rabbi Jonathan Wittenberg, leaders from the Church of Scotland, Baptist Union, Methodist Church and United Reformed Church, a representative of Sikhs in Scotland, and the Territorial Leaders of the Salvation Army.

Introduction

The Dandelion Community is a partnership between the United Reformed Church and local community organisations in Woodhouse Park, Wythenshawe. As part of the mission of local United Reformed Church, the church buildings are used extensively by the partners in the Dandelion Community to support the wellbeing of people in the local community.

At present the buildings are managed by a Mission Project of the United Reformed Church's North Western Synod. Our ambition is to transfer the responsibility for the management of the buildings and the church's community outreach to a new charitable organisation established jointly with local community partners by the end of 2026.

Role Purpose

This post provides the day to day operational management of the Christian Community Hub ensuring that it both provides both a safe environment for staff, volunteers and users, but also is a vibrant and welcoming place for all.

The post holder will be responsible for the operation and development of process and procedures necessary to ensure the smooth running of the Hub, build on positive and supportive relationships between the church, community partners, staff and volunteers.

 presence and can contribute to the programme of activities and events in the Hub
- Represent Dandelion Community when working in the community with statutory agencies, local residents, stakeholders, and partners

Hub Management and Operations

- Act as the responsible person for the building
- Ensure the building is safe and secure with any maintenance issues reported and managed
- Maintain a calendar of all bookings and other activities within the centre
- Ensure risk assessment forms are completed and updated for all activities in the Centre
- Ensure all materials and resources are maintained and up to date
- To work alongside the Dandelion Community Management Group to ensure safeguarding, health
 & safety, and data protection policies and procedures are implemented and work well

- 9. Self-motivated, able to prioritise successfully, and resilient, dealing calmly with unexpected difficulties
- 10. Flexible and open to feedback and change with an awareness of their own strengths and weaknesses and the humility to learn from colleagues
- 11. Positive, outgoing and a team player
- 12. Desirable: relevant lived poverty experience
